- 3) An abstract consisting of the title and a short summary of the Ph.D. candidate's presentation (150-200 words)

### **Upon Acceptance of your Submission**

All applicants will be notified by Friday, 23<sup>rd</sup> March, 2018, or shortly after. Successful applicants will be required to submit full workshop papers of 12-15 pages/7000-8000 words to the above email addresses by Thursday 26<sup>th</sup> April, 2018. Each presenter will be given a maximum of 15 minutes to give their presentation. Any presentation slides or materials for the oral presentation should be emailed to the organisers no later than **Thursday 26<sup>th</sup> April, 2018** At the end of the workshop, each presenter will receive a participation certificate and the best papers will be published in the European School of Law Journal.

### **Logistics/Fees**

No fees are required. However, all travel and accommodation expenses are borne by the participant. The address of Bangor Law School is College Rd, Bangor, Gwynedd, LL57 2DG, Wales, the UK. Bangor is in the North West of Wales and is about two and a half hours' train journey from Manchester and Liverpool airports.
